LABOR AND RISK IN PUBLIC SCHOLARSHIP: RACE, GENDER, AND DIGITAL HARASSMENT

Dorothy Kim teaches Medieval Literature at Vassar College. She was named by Diverse: Issues in Higher Ed 2015 Emerging Scholar under 40.

Dorothy Kim has been attacked, repeatedly, online for speaking out against White Supremacy, sexism, and racism in academia generally and in her field, Medieval Studies, more specifically. But she still continues to speak out — directly, forcefully, publicly.

This talk will address the dog whistle of "free speech" now used in attacks on university faculty as a way for the alt-right to gain access to college campuses. Through the story of her own experience, Professor Kim will discuss the rise and visibility of academic white supremacy as it has become a conduit for white supremacist ideology to infiltrate the academy.
